#### **4 First Aid Measures**

# Inhalation:

If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. Seek medical attention if breathing problems develop.

#### Ingestion:

If swallowed, do not induce vomiting. Immediately rinse mouth with water. Give 2-3 glasses of water. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. Seek medical attention.

# **6 Accidental Release Measures**
